RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

THE RAPPAHANNOCK AREA OFFICE ON YOUTH'S RESIDENTIAL SERVICES OVERSEES THE CHAPLIN YOUTH CENTER, A 12 BED, COMMUNITY BASED, COED RESIDENTIAL FACILITY SERVING YOUTH AGES 12-17. IT IS LICENSED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE JUSTICE. CHAPLIN PROVIDES 24 HOUR SUPERVISION IN A SAFE AND STRUCTURED ENVIRONMENT, IN WHICH RESIDENTS ARE EMPOWERED WITH BEHAVIOR MODIFICATION TOOLS THAT FACILITATE THE DEVELOPMENT OF HEALTHY AND PRODUCTIVE PATTERNS OF BEHAVIOR.

- YOUTH MUST BE COURT ORDERED OR ORDERED
 VIA A SHELTER CARE ORDER BY AN INTAKE OFFICER
- A RETURN COURT DATE MUST BE SET FOR
 DISCHARGE OF THE YOUTH OR THE CSU MUST
 REQUEST FOR RELEASE AUTHORITY WHEN THE
 YOUTH IS INITIALLY ORDERED INTO SHELTER CARE

POST-DISPOSITIONAL GROUP HOME

- A 6-12 MONTH PROGRAM FOR COURT-INVOLVED YOUTH WHO REQUIRE INTENSIVE BEHAVIOR MODIFICATION
- PROGRAM IS DESIGNED TO PROMOTE POSITIVE CHANGES IN DECISION MAKING SKILLS WHILE ALSO DEVELOPING COPING SKILLS, ANGER MANAGEMENT, AND LIFE SKILLS
- A REFERRAL FROM A REGIONAL AGENCY OR COMMUNITY PARTNER IS REQUIRED, AND INVOLVES A PRE-PLACEMENT APPLICATION AND INTERVIEW PROCESS TO DETERMINE THE APPROPRIATENESS OF PLACEMENT

ROOM & BOARD FEES ARE \$250 PER DAY FOR THE CITY OF FREDERICKSBURG, SPOTSYLVANIA COUNTY, & STAFFORD COUNTY. OUTSIDE LOCALITY FEES ARE \$275 PER DAY.

THE POVERTY SIMULATION

THE COMMUNITY ACTION POVERTY SIMULATION (CAPS) BRIDGES THAT GAP FROM MISCONCEPTION TO UNDERSTANDING THE REALITY FOR MANY INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES EXPERIENCING POVERTY. CAPS IS AN INTERACTIVE IMMERSION EXPERIENCE. IT SENSITIZES COMMUNITY PARTICIPANTS TO THE REALITIES OF POVERTY AND HELPS IDENTIFY AREAS OF CHANGE THAT CAN DIRECTLY IMPACT THE EFFECTS OF POVERTY ON INDIVIDUALS, FAMILIES, AND COMMUNITIES.

RESTORATIVE PRACTICES IN EDUCATION

THE RESTORATIVE PRACTICES IN EDUCATION TRAINING PROVIDES LEARNING AND GUIDED DEVELOPMENT OF A WHOLE SCHOOL PLAN TO BRING THE PHILOSOPHY AND PRINCIPLES OF RESTORATIVE PRACTICES IN SCHOOLS. RAOOY FACILITATORS WORK ALONGSIDE AND GUIDE THE RESTORATIVE PRACTICE TEAM THROUGH MULTIPLE SESSIONS IN DEVELOPMENT OF THE WHOLE SCHOOL PLAN, AND ESTABLISH A WORKABLE AND REASONABLE TIMELINE FOR IMPLEMENTATION.
